Important Safety Instructions

Your Prestigio PC Tablet is manufactured and designed for mobile usage. Please read the following instructions carefully:

- 1. Do not place objects on top of the PC Tablet as objects may scratch the screen.
- 2. PC Tablet should be kept away from extreme changes of temperature.
- 3. Protect it from direct sunlight or heat sources.
- 4. Protect the device from moisture and from dusty or smoky environment as it can harm the device.
- 5. Keep your PC tablet away from contact with active chemicals.
- 6. Do not place the PC Tablet on an uneven or unstable surface. Fall of the device can cause damage to the LCD screen which is not covered with warranty.
- 7. Do not expose the PC Tablet to strong magnetic or electrical field.
- 8. Protect your PC Tablet from hits and extreme pressure.
- 9. Operation Temperature: This PC Tablet should only be used in environments with ambient temperatures between 0°C (32°F) and 45°C (113°F).
- 10. Do not insert into PC Tablet devices or items not matching to standard sockets on it.

- 22. Your PC Tablet must be switched off during airplane take-off and landing.

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

3. Getting started

Do not cover the antenna area with your hands or other objects. This may cause connectivity problems or drain the battery.

Please read the "Important Safety Instructions" before use.

3.1 Install the SIM card



- 1. Shut down the device, then open the SIM slot lid.
- 2. Insert the micro SIM into the slot: metal contacts down, cut edge facing in. Press down until it clicks.
- 3. Close the SIM card cover

WARNING!

- The use of incompatible SIM cards, manually cut SIM card, or SIM card adapters may damage the cards or the device, and it may corrupt the data stored on the cards.
- Scratching or bending of the SIM cards may result in the loss of contacts and information, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the cards.
- Keep the SIM card out of the reach of children.

3.2 Insert a memory card

- 1. Insert the memory card into the slot with the correct side.
- 2. Press down until it clicks.

WARNING!

- Some memory cards may not be fully compatible with the device. Using an incompatible card may damage the device or the memory card, or corrupt the data stored in it.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data shortens the lifespan of memory cards.



3.3 Charge the battery

A new battery is partially charged.

- 1. Plug the small end of the USB cable into the micro USB port of the device, and plug the large end of the cable into the charger.
- 2. After being fully charged, disconnect the device from the charger. First unplug the charger from the device, and then unplug it from the electric socket.

WARNING!

- Always use authentic accessories to optimise your battery performance. Non-authentic accessories can damage your battery and even your tablet.
- Here are some tips to help you optimise your battery performance:
- always ensure that your tablet profile is appropriately set to meet your actual usage.
- if you are not using Bluetooth, Wi-Fi or other applications, turn them off.
- adjust the intensity of your display screen's backlight to low or medium level and for the shortest duration.
- avoid using or placing your tablet near magnetic objects (eg. a radio or television) or on metal surfaces, which will impact the network connection and ultimately drain power from your battery.

3.4 Power on your tablet

Press and hold the power button for a few seconds to power on your tablet.

After loading the tablet, the Installer Prestigio Wizard will appear on the screen. It offers you several third-party applications. Tap the apps you want to install on your tablet. Follow the onscreen instructions to install the apps.

It may take a few minutes for your tablet to install the apps.

To turn off your tablet, press and hold the power button, and then tap Power off on the pop-up screen.

Disclaimer!

You can choose not to install the programs Installer Prestigio Wizard suggests on the first boot. You can launch Installer Prestigio Wizard from the Home screen later to install them later.

3.5 Home screen

Your Home screen is the starting point to access all of your tablet's features. The Home screen can have multiple panels. Swipe left or right to view them.

Tap • to return to the Home screen. Your tablet's Home screen consists of the following:



Personalise your wallpaper

Pick your favourite photo as your Home wallpaper. Choose from the available wallpapers, or use any photo you have taken with the camera.

1. Tap and hold the blank area on the Home screen.

Select one of the following: **Gallery**, **Live wallpaper**, or **Wallpaper**.

3. Select an image and tap Set wallpaper. Or, select an image, resize it by dragging the frame, and then tap **OK**.

Add an app icon to Home screen

- 1. On the main screen, swipe up to open the list menu.
- 2. Tap and hold an application icon.
- 3. Drag it into a panel preview.

Remove an item on Home screen

- 1. Tap and hold an item to remove.
- 2. The **Remove** option appears at the top of the Home screen.
- 3 Drag the item to the **Remove** option.
- 4. When the option turns red, release the item.


3.6 List menu

On the Home screen, swipe up from bottom to top to open the list menu. The list menu may consist of several panels.

Swipe left or right to view other panels.

Tap or to return to the Home screen. The list menu of your tablet consists of the following areas:






4. Basics


4.1 Gesture control

Only use your fingers to use the touch screen.




Tap

To open an application, to select a menu item, to press an on-screen button, or to enter a character using the on-screen keyboard, tap it with a finger.




Tap and hold

Tap and hold the item for more than 2 seconds to access extra options.




Swipe

Quickly swipe your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen to go to other home pages, scroll through documents, and more.



Slide or scroll

Move your finger vertically across the screen to open the drop-down menu. Drag up or down to scroll.



Zoom in

Spread two fingers apart on a web page, map, or image to zoom in a part.





Zoom out

Pinch two fingers together on a web page, map, or image to zoom out a part.



Flick

Flick left or right on the Home screen or the applications screen to see another panel. Flick up or down to scroll through a web page or a list, such as contacts.


4.2 Notifications panel

When you get a new notification, you can open the notifications panel to see what event notification or new information you have received.

- To open the notifications panel, slide down from the top of the screen.
- Drag Notifications Panel up to close it.
- To dismiss the notification, tap =


4.3 Quick settings

Quick settings allow you to easily turn on airplane mode, Wi-Fi and other options, and it also provides a quick shortcut to change the mode, set the brightness, and auto rotation. Slide down from the top right corner on the screen to open quick settings.



4.4 Status icons

The icons in the status bar at the top of the screen give information about your tablet:



4.5 Connect to your PC

Your tablet's micro USB port allows you to exchange media and other files with a PC.

Load files from your PC

- 1. Connect your tablet to the PC with the included USB cable.
- 2. Open the notification bar, select **Connect as Media Device** > **Media device**.

3. Transfer files between your PC and tablet.

4.6 Enabling/disabling screen lock

When not in use, lock your tablet to prevent unwanted operations and save the battery power.

- Lock: press the power button.
- Unlock: press the power button, and then slide the lock icon to unlock your screen.

When your tablet is locked, nothing happens if you touch the screen. Your tablet can still:

- receive calls, text messages, and other updates.
- play music;
- adjust the volume.

You can use the earphones to answer a call or listen to music.

Auto lock

You can set a time span for the screen to be locked automatically.

- 1. On the list menu, tap **Settings > Display > Sleep mode.**
- 2. Select your desired time span for Sleep mode.

Set screen lock pattern

Protect your personal information and prevent others from using your tablet without your permission by setting a screen lock pattern, PIN, or password. You will be asked to unlock the screen every time your tablet is powered on or when it is idle for a certain period of time.

On the list menu, tap **Settings** > **Security** > **Screen lock**.

Unlock your tablet

Turn on the screen by pressing the power button, and enter the unlock code.

If you have forgotten your screen lock pattern or code, you have up to five attempts to try and unlock your tablet. If this fails, take the device to your dealer to reset it.

4.7 Enter text

Change the input method

You can download an input app or use the input method pre-installed on your tablet. To change the input method, follow these steps:

- In the list of applications, tap **Settings > System > Language and Input > Keyboards.**
- Choose the desired input method.



Use the Prestigio keyboard





Enter text

- Type uppercase: tap the Shift key before tapping a letter. Or touch and hold the Shift key, then tap a letter.
- Type lowercase: tap the Shift key again and then tap a letter.
- Enter numbers, symbols or punctuation: tap [8123].

Cut or Copy text

1. Select the text you want to copy, and tap 🗷 or 🗉 .

The selected text is then copied to the clipboard.

- 2. In a text entry field, press and hold at the point where you want to paste the text.
- 3. Tap Paste.

4.8 System upgrade

Your tablet can check and notify you if there is a new upgrade available. You can also manually check if there is an available update. You can set this option in **Settings** > **About device** > **System updates.**

WARNING!

Do not press any buttons while the device is upgrading.



5. Web & network

You can connect your tablet to the Internet and browse a web page.


5.1 Connect to the Internet

Your tablet can be connected to the Internet whenever necessary, using a Wi-Fi connection (if available) or your mobile operator's data connection.

Data connection

You can use your mobile operator's data connection. Pay your attention that some apps and services may transfer data over your mobile operator's cellular network, which may result in additional fees. Contact your mobile operator for details.

Turn on or off data connection



- 2. Tap Network and Internet > Mobile Networks > Enable data transfer.
- 3. Tap to turn on or off data connection.

CAUTION!

If cellular data is off and there is no Wi-Fi available, you will not be able to automatically receive emails, update social media account information, or sync data.

Turn on or off data roaming

Connect to your mobile operator's partner networks and access data services when you are out of your mobile operator's coverage area.

CAUTION!

Using cellular data in the roaming mode may cost much. Contact your mobile service provider for details.

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap 🤨 .
- 2. Tap Network and Internet > Mobile Networks > Enable data transfer in roaming.
- 3. Tap to turn on or off data connection.

Keep track of your data usage

You can control data usage in apps, including viewing pages on the web, syncing accounts, sending emails, etc.

To help you save on data usage, connect to a Wi-Fi network whenever possible and set your online accounts and e-mails to sync less frequently.

Caution: data usage measured by your tablet may vary with your actual data usage.

1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap 🤨 .



- 2. Tap **Data usage**.
- 3. In the **Mobile** tab, enable data transfer, choose **Set limit** to disable connection once the data usage limit is reached.



- 4. Tap **Data usage cycle**, you can set a particular time interval to see how much data you have used.
- 5. Drag the red line marker to set your monthly data limit.

Wi-Fi

Connect the device to a Wi-Fi network to use the Internet or share media files with other devices. To use Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless point or hotspot.

The availability and strength of the Wi-Fi signal will vary depending on the environment, such as building structure or simply a wall between rooms.

Connect to a wireless network

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap (2), then tap **Network and Internet** > **Wi-Fi**, to enable the connection.
- 2. The Wi-Fi section will show the list of networks detected.
- 3. Tap the desired Wi-Fi network you want to connect to.
- 4. If you selected a secured network, you will be asked to enter the network key or password.

The next time your tablet connects to a previously accessed wireless network, you will not be asked to enter the key or other security information again.

Turn on or off Wi-Fi

Follow these steps:

- On quick settings tap WI-FI.
- On the Home screen or list menu, tap , then tap **Network and Internet** > **Wi-Fi**, to enable or disable the connection.

Erase a saved wireless network

Any network that has ever been used, including the current network, can be erased. Your tablet will not automatically connect to it.

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap , then tap **Network and Internet** > **Wi-Fi**.
- 2. Tap the wireless network you have previously been connected to.
- 3. Tap Forget.

Use your tablet as a wireless router

Share your data connection with other devices by turning your tablet into a wireless router.

- Make sure the data connection is turned on.
- You must have an approved data plan associated with your account from your mobile service provider to use this service.
- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap
- 2. Tap Network and Internet > Set up Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3. In **Set up Wi-Fi hotspot**, enter a router name or use the default router name.
- 4. Choose the type of security and set the password (key) for your wireless router.
- If you selected None in Security, you do not need to enter a password. The password is



the key other people need to enter on their device so they can connect and use your tablet as a wireless router.

5. Tap to turn on portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

Share your mobile data connection by USB tethering

To enable Internet connection on your PC, you can use your tablet as a hotspot — having connected it to the PC over USB.

- 1. Connect your tablet to the computer with the included USB cable.
- 2. On the Home screen or list menu, tap 🤨 .
- 3. Make sure that data connection is turned on.
- 4. Tap Network and Internet > Connections > Mobile Access Points.
- 5. Tap to turn on **USB** tethering.

WARNING!

- Make sure your SIM card is inserted on your tablet.
- You may need access to USB hotspot service (provided by the carrier). Such connections may increase the cost of carrier services. Contact your mobile service provider for details.

5.2 Browse a web page

You can use your tablet to browse websites. Before browsing a website, please confirm that you have turn on data connection or Wi-Fi.

Browse a web page

On the Home screen or list menu, tap



Enter your search keywords or a web page address.

While browsing a web page, you can:

- Tap to go to the previous web page.
- Tap to go to the next web page.
- Tap c to reload the current page (while data are being updated, the icon is changed to).
- Tap 🔯 to bookmark the current web page.
- Tap to search for information.
- Tap ito close the current tab.
- Tap to open a new tab.
- Tap to browse web pages from **Bookmarks**, **History** and **Saved pages**.

Add bookmarks

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap
- 2. Enter your search keywords or a web page address.



- 3. Browse a web page.
- 4. Tap 🔯 .

Download files

You can download files and apps directly from your favourite websites.

WARNING!

- Files and apps downloaded from the web can be from unknown sources. To protect your tablet and personal data, we strongly recommend that you download and open only the files you trust.
- Before you can install the downloaded app, you need to set your tablet to allow installation of third-party apps in **System settings** > **Security** > **Unknown sources**.
- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap .
- 2. Go to the desired page.
- 3. Follow the website's download instructions for apps.

View your downloads



- 1. On the Home screen, tap
- 2. Tap the file to open it.

Browser settings

You can change browser settings for comfortable work. Configure display, privacy, security, and other settings. For that, tap > Settings on the browser screen.

6. Mail

Use this application to send or view e-mail messages. Learn to send or view e-mail messages via your personal or company e-mail account.

6.1 Set up an e-mail account

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap ${}^{\,\,\,\,\,\,}$:
- If this is your first time adding an e-mail account in Mail, move to the next step.
- If you have already added an e-mail account, then tap -> Settings > Add account.
- 2. Enter the e-mail address and password for your e-mail account.
- 3. Tap Next for a private e-mail account, or tap Manual setup for a company e-mail account.
- 4. Follow the prompts to complete the setup.

When you finish setting up the e-mail account, the e-mail messages will download to your device.

Consult your mail service provider for the mail server configuration.

6.2 Send a mail

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap
- 2. Switch to the e-mail account that you want to use.
- 3. Tap ____.
- 4. Fill in one or more recipients.
- To add recipients, use the Copy (Cc) and Bcc (Bcc) fields. Tap , then tap Add CC/BCC.
- 5. Enter the subject, and then compose your mail.
- Add an attachment: tap -> Attach file and then choose the files you want to send out.
- 6. Tap > to send the mail.

6.3 Messages

- 1. Tap \mathcal{C} to check for new messages.
- 2. Tap the desired mail to read it.
- 3. Use or to view the previous or next mail.

Search for a mail

- 1. Tap \bigcirc to display the search bar.
- 2. Choose a search option in the drop-down list.
- 3. Enter the first few letters of the mail sender or subject in the search bar.
- 4. Select the mail from the list.

6.4 Reply to a mail

- 1. On the e-mail inbox, tap the e-mail message.
- 2. Tap 🛧 ,and then compose your mail.
- 3. Tap > to send the mail.



6.5 Delete mails

Tap the mail you wish to delete, and then tap i.


6.6 Gmail

Use this application to quickly and directly access the **Google Mail service**.

View your Gmail Inbox

All your received e-mail messages are delivered to your Inbox.

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap ...
- 2. Your mail inbox is displayed on the screen.
- 3. On the e-mail inbox, tap > **Refresh** to check whether there is a new mail.
- 4. Tap the desired mail to read it.
- 5. Swipe left or right to view the previous or next mail.




7. Camera

With your tablet, you can take both photos and videos as desired. In addition to the main camera on the back of the device, there is an extra camera for video calls and selfies on the front panel. An LED flash on the back gives you extra light when you need it.

To use the camera, on the Home screen or list menu, tap .



7.1 Your camera at a glance



Select the camera mode

You can select one of the suggested camera modes:



Single photo

Record a video

7.2 Take a photo

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Spread or pinch the screen to zoom in or out.
- 3. Change the camera settings if necessary.
- 4. Point the camera at what you want to capture. The camera adjusts the focus automatically as you move it.
- 5. Tap o to capture the photo.

7.3 Take a photo of yourself

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Tap 🌣 > 🗓 .
- 3. Tap o to shoot.

7.4 Using HDR

When shooting portraits against a bright background, use the HDR (High Dynamic Range) scene to capture your subjects clearly. HDR brings out the details of both the highlights and shadows, even in high contrast lighting.

- 1. Turn on the camera
- 2. Tap 🌣 > ĤƊR .
- 3. When you are ready to take the photo, tap .

Do not move your tablet during HDR capturing.

7.5 Record a video

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Tap , , then swipe right .

While recording, use the following actions:

- Freely zoom in or out.
- To capture an image from the video while recording, just tap the screen.
- To capture an image from the video while recording, just tap the screen.
- To stop recording, tap \bigcirc .

7.6 Camera and video settings

Before you take a photo or record a video, customise your camera settings.

- 1. Turn on the camera.
- 2. Select / and then tap > to change the settings.

GPS location: Attach a GPS location tag to the photo.

Picture size: Select from various standard sizes for your picture.

Select ISO: An ISO value indicates the light sensitivity of your camera's imaging sensor. The parameter is measured in the equivalent of a film camera: low ISO values are used for shooting static or bright objects; high ISO values are used for shooting rapidly-moving or poorly-lit objects.

Exposure: This determines how much light the camera's sensor receives. For lowlight situations, use a higher exposure.

White balance: Select an appropriate white balance, so images have a true-to-life colour range. The settings are designed for specific lighting situations. These settings are similar to the heat range for white-balance exposure in professional cameras.

Colour Effect: Select among various photo effects to suit your needs.

Scene mode: Select your desired scene mode.

Face detection: Set the ideal exposure and clarity of faces.



Restore defaults: Restore to default settings.

Disclaimer!

To improve GPS signals, avoid shooting in locations where the signal may be obstructed, such as between buildings or in low-lying areas, or in poor weather conditions.

Your location may appear on your photos when you upload them to the Internet. To avoid this, deactivate the GPS location info.

8. Multimedia

You can use your table to view photos, listen to music, and watch videos.


8.1 Gallery

Use Gallery to view all your photos and videos on your tablet.

To open your Gallery on the Home screen or list menu, tap ...

Some file formats may not be supported depending on the software installed on your device.

View your photos



2. Tap on a photo to open it in full screen.

Zoom in and out

Use one of the following methods to zoom in or zoom out an image:

- Double-tap on the photo to zoom in.
- Spread two fingers apart on any place to zoom in. Pinch to zoom out.

Edit your photos

When viewing a photo, tap to use the following functions:

- **Slideshow**: Start a slideshow with images in the current folder.
- Use as: Use the photo as wallpaper or contact photo.
- **Delete from device**: Delete the photo from device permanently.
- Print: you can print a photo with the connected printer or save it as PDF.

Share your photos

You can share your photos with another device via e-mail, MMS or Bluetooth.

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap 🥙 .
- 2. Select the photo you want to share.
- 3. Tap \lt to open the drop-down menu, then choose the data transfer method.

Delete photos

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap
- 2. Select the photo(s) that you want to delete.
- 3. Tap , and then tap **Delete.**

8.2 Video Player

You can use the video player to watch videos on your tablet.

Watch a video with video player

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap play movies.
- 2. Select the video that you want to watch.
- 3. Tap the on-screen keys to control the video playback.



- 4. Press the volume button to adjust the sound.
- 5. Tap to select more options.

Share your videos

You can share your photos and videos with another device via e-mail, MMS or Bluetooth.

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap play movies.
- 2. Select the video that you want to share.
- 3. Tap < to open the drop-down menu, then choose the data transfer method.

8.3 Music Player

You can listen to your favourite music, whether it is stored in your tablet or streamed through a music service.

- To use the music player, on the Home screen or list menu, tap O.

Browse music

- 1. On the Home screen, tap O.
- 2. You can:
- Tap Artists/Albums/Playlists to browse songs sorted by artists, albums, or playlists.
- Tap **Songs** to browse all songs.
- Tap **Now playing** to check the song that is playing now.

Listen to music

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap o.
- 2. Tap a song from the list.
- 3. Use the following keys to control playback:

You must connect a headset before using the FM radio on your tablet.

9. Messages

You can exchange SMS and MMS messages with other devices. Your sent and received messages are neatly grouped into conversations, by contact name or phone number.

9.1 Send a message

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap
- 2. Tap start chat to start composing a new message.
- 3. To add recipients:
- Enter a phone number.
- Tap 🔩. select contacts, and then tap **OK**.
- 4. Enter the text message in the text box.
- 5. Tap to add picture / video / audio / slideshow if you want to send an MMS message.
- 6. Tap to send the mail.

There is a limit on the number of characters for a single text message (displayed above the send button). If you exceed the limit, your text message will be delivered as one but will be billed as more than one message.

9.2 View your messages

Depending on your notification settings, your tablet plays a sound, vibrates, or displays the message briefly in the status bar when you receive a new message. A new message icon is also displayed in the status bar. Incoming messages are grouped into message threads by contact.

- Open the notifications panel, and then tap the new message notification.
- Go to the Messages app and open the message.

9.3 Reply to a message

- 1. On the messages screen, tap a contact (or phone number) to display the exchange of messages with that contact.
- 2. In the text box, enter your message.
- 3. Tap to send the message.

9.4 Forward or delete a message

- 1. On the messages screen, tap a contact (or phone number) to display the exchange of messages with that contact.

- 3. In the pop-up window (Message options), select Forward or Delete.

9.5 Delete a conversation

- 1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap
- 2. The messages screen is displayed.
- 3. Tap and hold a contact or phone number.
- 4. Tap **1**.

10. Bluetooth

Your tablet can connect to a compatible Bluetooth device for exchanging data. Bluetooth creates a direct wireless connection between two devices over short distances.

• Do not use the Bluetooth feature for illegal purposes (for example, pirating copies of files or illegally tapping communications for commercial purposes).

Pair with a Bluetooth device

- 1. Tap > Connection settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Turn on Bluetooth.
- 3. A list of available Bluetooth devices will appear.
- 4. Select the device you wish to connect with.
- 5. Tap **Pair**. The pairing is made if your pairing request is accepted by the other device.

Unpair with a Bluetooth device

- 1. Select the device you want to unpair and then tap
- 2. Tap **Unpair**.

Send data via Bluetooth

- 1. Tap 💿 > Connection settings> Bluetooth.
- 2. Turn on **Bluetooth**.
- 3. Pair with a Bluetooth device.
- 4. Select the file you want to share.
- 5. Tap < to send the file via Bluetooth.
- 6. Select a device to start sending the file.

Receive data via Bluetooth

- 1. Tap 🔞 > Connection settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Turn on Bluetooth.
- 3. Tap your tablet model to make it visible to all nearby Bluetooth devices.
- 4. Accept the request and pair with the other Bluetooth device.
- 5. Open notifications panel, tap **Accept**.

The files received via Bluetooth are stored in the Bluetooth folder.

11. Google Maps

Use this application to pinpoint the location of your tablet, search for places, or get directions.

11.1 Use Google Maps

Google Maps lets you track your current location and receive detailed directions to your destination. It also provides a search tool where you can locate places of interest or an address on a map, or view locations at street level.

On the Home screen or list menu, tap X.

11.2 Find a location

Turn on or off location service

In order to find your location on your tablet, you need to enable location service.

If you are in an area where there are a lot of surrounding buildings, Locations may have a hard time pinpointing your location.

You can search for a name of an establishment, street, or city. Suggested matches will be shown while you type.

- 3. Enter the place you want to search for.
- 4. Select the desired place in the result list.

11.3 Get directions

- 4. Enter your start point and end point.
- 5. The map opens showing the route to your destination.

Maps settings

You can set up the **Google Maps**, tap **Settings** while viewing the maps.

12. Utilities

12.1 Clock

Use the clock app to set alarms, check the time of any location in the world, measure the duration of an event, or set a timer.

World clock

You can add a city to the world clock screen.

1. On the Home screen or list menu, tap .



- 2. Tap **?**.
- 3. Scroll through the list and tap the city that you want to add.

Alarm

You can set up one or more alarms.

Set an alarm

- 1. On the clock screen, tap ①.
- 2. Tap to add a new alarm.
- 3. Use the virtual digit keyboard to set the alarm time.
- 4. Tap **OK**.
- 5. If you want the alarm for multiple days, tap **Repeat**.

Turn off an alarm

- 1. Select the alarm you want to turn off.
- 2. Drag the slider to Off.

Stop an alarm

When the alarm rings,

- Move to ** to stop the alarm.
- Slide to ZZZ. The alarm will sound again after a specific length of time.

Delete an alarm

- 1. Select the alarm you want to delete.
- 2. Tap **1**.

You can create events and make plans on your calendar.

Wi-Fi

Activate the Wi-Fi feature to connect to a Wi-Fi network and access the Internet or other network devices.

Bluetooth

Activate the Bluetooth feature to exchange information over short distances.

Data usage

Keep track of your data usage amount, and customise the setting for a limitation.

More options

More options:

Airplane mode

Activate airplane mode to disable all wireless functions on your device. You can use only nonnetwork features.

Airplane mode disables the wireless features in order to reduce potential interference with aircraft operations and other electrical equipment.

VPN

Set up and manage virtual private networks (VPNs).

Tethering & portable hotspot

- Set to use your device as a wireless modem by making a USB connection with a computer.
- Set to use your device as a wireless access point for other devices.

Access device information and update device software. View different information about the tablet, such as the battery, legal information, model number, software version, baseband version and build number.

14. Specific absorption rate (SAR)

14.1 Compliance with international standards

This device complies with international guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile tablet is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy defined by the international standards. These recommendations have been established by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) and, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) that forecast a substantial safety margin for assuring the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure recommendations for mobile tablets use a measurement unit known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit recommended by the ICNIRP for the mobile tablets used by the general public is **2.0W/kg averaged over ten grams of tissue and, is 1.6W/kg averaged over one gram of tissue** by IEEE Std 1528 for the head.

Tests for SAR have been conducted using recommended operating positions with the mobile tablet transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR levels of the mobile tablet while operating are generally below the maximum SAR value. This is because the tablet is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station antenna, the lower the power output.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various tablets and at various positions, they all meet the international protection standards for exposure to radio waves. The highest SAR value for this model when tested for compliance against the standard was

0.796 W/kg (10g) for ICNIRP recommendation. For limiting the radio waves exposure, it is recommended to reduce the mobile tablet call duration or to use a headset. The purpose of those precautions is to take the mobile tablet away from the head and the body.

15. Troubleshooting

The display shows BLOCKED when you switch on the tablet

Somebody tried to use your tablet but did not know the PIN code nor the unblocking code (PUK). Contact your service provider.

The display shows IMSI failure

This problem is related to your subscription. Contact your operator.

The network symbol is not displayed

The network connection is lost. Either you are in a radio shadow (in a tunnel or between tall buildings) or you are outside the network coverage area. Try from another place, try to reconnect to the network (especially when abroad), or contact your network operator for assistance/information.

The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your device has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen. Protective covers may prevent the device from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local dealer.

Your battery seems to over heat

You might be using a charger that was not intended for use with your tablet. Make sure you always use the authentic accessory shipped with your tablet.

Your tablet does not display the phone numbers of incoming calls

This feature is network and subscription dependent. If the network does not send the caller's number, the phone will display Call 1 or Withheld instead. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can not send text messages

Some networks do not allow message exchanges with other networks. First check that you have entered the number of your SMS centre, or contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can not receive and/or store JPEG pictures

A picture may not be accepted by your tablet if it is too large, if its name is too long, or if it does not have the correct file format.

You feel that you have missed some calls

Check your call divert options.

When charging, the battery icon shows no bar and the outline is flashing

Only charge the battery in an environment where the temperature does not go below

0°C (32°F) or above 45°C (113°F). In other cases, please contact your tablet supplier.

The display shows SIM failure

Check that the SIM card has been inserted correctly. If the problem persists, your SIM card may be damaged. Contact your operator.

Your tablet does not work well in your car

The car has many metal parts that absorb electromagnetic waves, and they may affect your tablet's operation. A car kit is available to provide you with an external antenna and enables you to make and receive phone calls without handling the handset. Check with the local authorities whether or not you are allowed to use the tablet while driving.

Your tablet is not charging

If the battery is completely flat, it might take several minutes of precharge (up to 5 minutes in some cases) before the charging icon is displayed on the screen.

The picture captured with the tablet camera is not clear

Make sure that the camera lens on both sides is clean.

When you turn on your device or while you are using the device, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

- Password: When the device lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the device.
- PIN: When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. You can disable this feature by using the Lock SIM card menu.
- PUK: Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
- PIN2: When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM or USIM card. Contact your mobile operator for details.

Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the Power button for 8-10 seconds.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. On the list menu, tap Settings > Back up & reset > Factory data reset > Reset device > Erase everything.

Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your tablet uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio cannot receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio

stations.

Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.

Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

A connection is not established when you connect the device to a computer

Ensure that the USB cable you are using is compatible with your device.

Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your computer.

If you are a Windows XP user, ensure that you have Windows XP Service Pack 3 or higher installed on your computer.

- Ensure that you have Windows Media Player 10 or higher installed on your computer.
